**City of Wood River Referendum**

Shall the City of Wood River, Nebraska, under the provisions of Chapter 19, Article 7 of the Nebraska Revised Statutes acquire and appropriate for the public use by the exercise of the power of eminent domain, the natural gas system owned by KNEnergy, Inc., a Kansas Corporation, domesticated in Nebraska, with a billing address of P.O. Box 150265, Lakewood, Colorado, located or operated partly within and partly without the City of Wood River, Nebraska, including the gas distribution system and gas pipelines, and consisting of pressure regulating stations, gas mains, service connections, meters, and other equipment, and all parts, tangible and intangible, of said gas system, needed and useful in the distribution and sale of natural gas and the rendering of gas service partly within and partly without the City of Wood River, Nebraska.

**Proposed Amendment No. 1**

A constitutional amendment to authorize the Legislature to provide that agricultural land and horticultural land, as defined by the Legislature, constitutes a separate and distinct class of property for purposes of taxation and that such land may be taxed by a method which results in values that are not uniform and proportionate with all other tangible property and franchises but which results in values that are uniform and proportionate upon all property within the class of agricultural land and horticultural land and to eliminate a provision permitting separate and distinct classification of such property.

**Proposed Amendment No. 2**

A constitutional amendment to provide a right to direct appeal to the Supreme Court in capital cases, to provide that the right of appeal in all other cases shall be to the appellate court or to the Supreme Court as may be provided by law, to provide for an appellate court, to authorize the Supreme Court to assign duties to judges of the appellate court, to eliminate specific provisions on the clerk and reporter of the Supreme Court, and to harmonize provisions.

**Proposed by Initiative Measure No. 405**

Shall the Nebraska Constitution be amended to provide that, for fiscal years ending after January 1, 1991: (1) Total appropriations for the state, funded with state taxes and fees, shall not be increased more than 2 percent over the prior year; and (2) Budgets of local governments shall not be increased by more than 2 percent over the prior fiscal year? An increase exceeding 2 percent state appropriations would be permitted if authorized by a four-fifths vote of the Legislature. An increase exceeding 2 percent for local governments would be permitted if approved by a majority vote of the electorate.
